Hazardous and harmful alcohol consumption: a key health determinant

- □ 7,5% of all ill health and 195,000 early deaths per year in EU
- ☐ In 15-29 year olds: 25% of male deaths and 10% of female deaths related to alcohol
- ☐ Risk factor in some 60 acute or chronic diseases
- Monetary costs of alcohol related harm in the EU estimated at €125bn in 2003 1,3% of GDP
 - > health care and prevention 22bn
 - policing and crime 33bn



Hazardous and harmful alcohol consumption: A European Problem

- Levels of alcohol consumption by adults have been falling, nevertheless the EU still holds world record in alcohol consumption.
- **☐** Most of the EU Member States have similar problems:
 - Underage drinking
 - Binge drinking
 - Drink driving








Access to alcohol

Not a big difference Was reported between the various age groups


Flash Eurobarometer 330/May 2011: young people (15-24 years) have been interviewed



Q9. How difficult or easy do you think it would be for you personally to obtain the following substances within 24 bours if you wanted some?


Buse all respondents, % by country

EU chronic disease reflection:


- initiated by Council Conclusions of December 2010

Idea of a Joint Action







Forthcoming Joint action on alcohol in Health Programme work plan 2013

Incentive for the Member States to intensify cooperation and develop common approaches.

3 core working package:

- Improving the monitoring of drinking habits and alcoholrelated harm
- Guidelines for low-risk alcohol consumption
- Good practice in the provision of information to protect children and young people and to prevent alcohol-related harm among adults

3 horizontal working package
