Australia as a Microcosm of Global Development in Surveillance?

- 1999 – No such thing as ‘Australian’ system
- 2001 – Process of harmonisation in data definitions and questions
- 2003 – Regional surveillance partnerships
- 2005 – National blueprint
- 2007 – Similar platforms, but diversity and local innovations

Focus on uses and users and build capacity (rather than aim for one standardised system)



Expanding Frontiers?

- Content – social/environmental factors (early part of the trajectory)
- Methods – mixed methods that fit within local infrastructure and cultural context
- Technology – telecommunications, automation
- Partners – local health units/providers, other sectors, communities; social theory, ethics, philosophy
