# The WHO Recommendations on Infant and Young Child feeding



- Initiate breastfeeding within the first hour of birth
- -Exclusively breastfed for the first 6 months of life meaning no other foods or liquids are provided, including water
- -Infants should be breastfed on demand that is as often as the child wants, day and night. No bottles, teats or pacifiers should be used.
- -From the age of 6 months, children should begin eating safe and adequate complementary foods while continuing to breastfeed for up to 2 years and beyond

**IYCF-E Response: The Goal** 

To protect, promote, and support adequate infant and young child feeding practices.



# Why is adequate IYCF Important?

#### World Health Organization European Region

# Globally

- Only 44% of infants initiate breastfeeding within the first hour after birth<sup>1</sup>
- Only 40% of all infants under 6 months of age are exclusively breastfed<sup>1</sup>
- 33% higher risk of dying in first 28 days for newborns who initiated after 2 hours.<sup>2</sup>
- Improved practices can save over 820,000 lives a year<sup>3</sup>
- Increased rates could add 300 billion US\$ to global economy yearly<sup>4</sup>
- During emergencies, rates of child mortality can soar up to 70 x higher than average<sup>7</sup>
- Complimentary feeding:
- 52% Minimum meal frequency
- 29% Minimum dietary diversity

Aims to stop the aggressive and inappropriate marketing of products covered by the Code

- Objective: the provision of safe and adequate nutrition for infants, by ensuring:
- the protection and promotion of breastfeeding
- the proper use of BMS when these are necessary, on the basis of adequate information and through appropriate marketing and distribution.

International Code of Marketing of Breast-milk Substitutes



#### The Code

Sets out the responsibilities of the infant food industry, health workers, governments and organizations.

Supports informed decision making that is impartial and free of commercial influences




